YEAR 1



Year 1 have started this term with a fantastic week reading, writing, making and playing all things dragon! The children were very inspired to describe their own dragon after reading the story 'Tell Me a Dragon' by Jackie Morris. We had some amazing descriptive writing, even including some similes. In maths we have been using a range of equipment to partition 2-digit numbers into Tens and Ones and the children were keen to extend their own learning to try out partitioning 3-digit numbers. Our classroom is already looking great with dragon masks being made to go up on the wall and a fabulous role play area which the children helped to design. We all think this is going to be a great term.





YEAR 2

Year 2 have started learning about the Odyssey, making their own wooden horses and squashing inside the stock cupboard to get a feeling of what it would have been like inside the Trojan Horse. Mr Scott defended himself valiantly but was suitably defeated by an avenging Greek army. We have also been busy learning about temperature and how to read thermometers in the hope that the reading might eventually go above 12 degrees Celsius!



YEAR 3



Magical times in Year 3! The children have received their acceptance letters to Hogwarts. Magic, Mischief and Mayhem are in the air! However, we solemnly swear that... we are learning in here! The children read the first chapter of "Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone" and analysed the methods JK Rowling used to engage her readers. They then wrote their own openings to a story featuring magic.

Our DT lesson has seen Year 3 children following the creative designs they made earlier to make their own musical instruments. The children thought about how to change the amplitude and the pitch of the sounds produced by our instruments. We cannot wait to finish our guitars, shakers and drums! We are very much looking forward to

Year 4 are having a wonderful time at Sacrewell Farm. We are on our first ever residential and have settled into farm life very well. YEAR 5




In English this week, the children have been working hard on their grammar skills, with a focus on cohesive devices and speech to advance the action. A range of pictures were available to help with their ideas, and the children were able to unveil a character's motive based on what they are saying. WOW!

In maths, there has been a focus on measurement of length. The children went outside and recorded their distances based on how far they can run in a short period. They then measured these, before converting



them to mm, cm, m and even km! The children recognised the importance of place value, and worked very hard in their pairs.

In Curriculum, the children learned about peace across the religions. We discussed beliefs and attitudes towards this, and created bright, colourful posters to promote this further. The children took their time with their designs, and their final pieces are sensational. Well done to all!



YEAR 6

This week, the children have brought in their fantastic Egyptian artefacts ready for our class museum. Creating paintings, hieroglyphics, sculptures, jewellery and games, they have been hard at work learning about Ancient Egyptian life. Next week, we will use the knowledge gained from our trip to the Gentleman's Society, to create a class museum which will display their creations. Well done Year 6.



In English lessons, the children have been creating 'Blackout Poems' and selecting words from a text to transform into poetry and artwork. The children showed careful consideration when selecting their words and have created some fabulous poetry and artwork - well done. All the work has been based on the class text, 'Kensuke's Kingdom' and the children have shown talent equal to that of the author!
