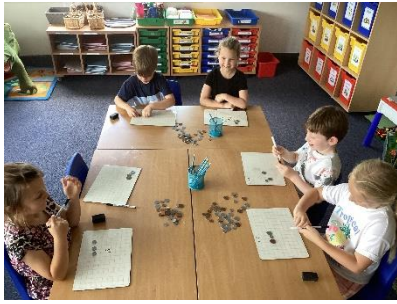
RECEPTION

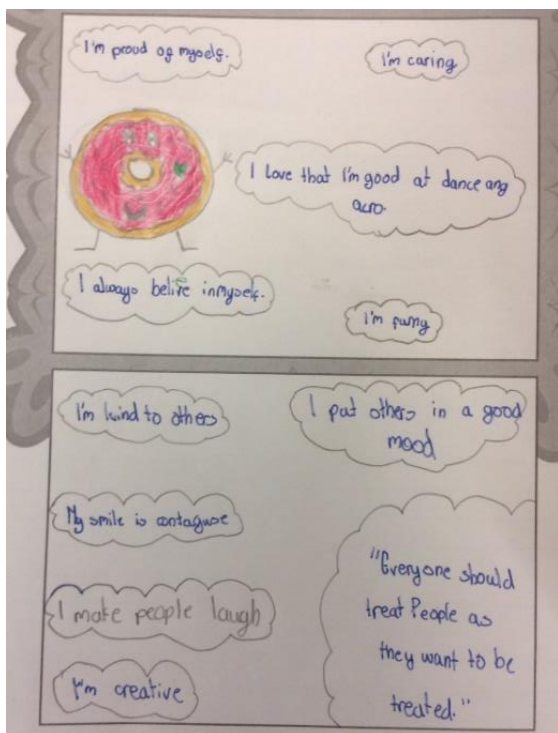
YEAR 4

YEAR 5

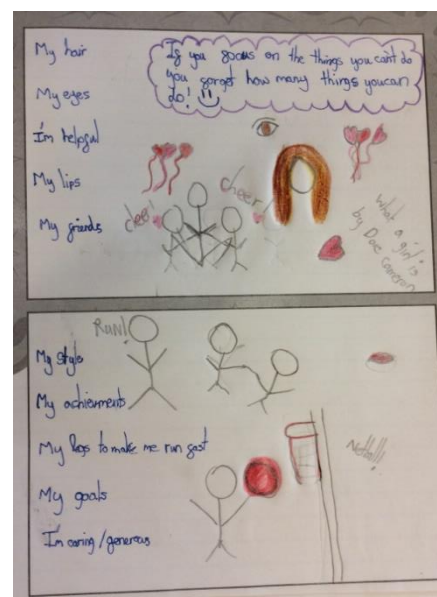


Year 5 have had great fun during STEM week this week! They were blessed with an electric car in school, and they learnt how this works with some fascinating facts learnt. We even managed to sit inside it! Spalding High School visited us for a Maths Workshop. They discussed the importance of Maths in the real world and how to spot patterns. The children were really engaged with this and posed some great questions to a Year 12 student.

In Maths, the children have been recapping the unit of fractions. Key areas revisited included the four operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division along with finding equivalent forms. There were some interesting discussions on this, and the children drew pictures to help with their understanding. In English, we have been completing short narratives based on the class reader: The Land of Never Believe. The children took on the role of the main character, met a group of unusual beings in a fascinating

place, and even created a 'build up' to a main problem.

In PSHE, the children discuss the importance of a positive mindset. In certain situations, we need to adapt this to overcome obstacles and achieve success. The children added their own thoughts with some lovely, positive quotes used.



YEAR 6



Year 6 have had a fantastic STEM and Wellbeing week and really enjoyed their fascinating talks from their visitors, participating in the mile walk and fruity Thursday!

On Monday, the Year 5 and 6 children had a fascinating talk from both teachers and students from Spalding High School. They learnt all about patterns in mathematics and how mathematical skills and concepts are used in the wider world context.

On Tuesday, they had a fabulous Technology Day, where they learnt about how technology is used in modern buildings and the amazing scientific research that is being done to find cures for illnesses. In both sessions, the children really impressed the teachers with their thoughtful questions and

their responses to questions posed. In the afternoon, they had the opportunity to find out about electric cars and really enjoyed their visit from Mr Howard and his BMW car.

All the children have really enjoyed the week and we are extremely grateful to our visitors for teaching us so much about STEM careers of the future.

In Forest School today the children were learning all about survival skills as part of their work on Kensuke's Kingdom.

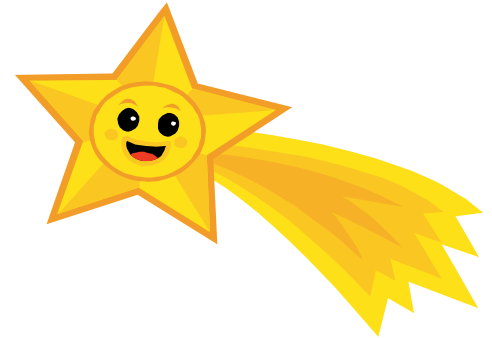
